A Word from Principal

Dear Parents and Students.

Time flies! We are in our second semester now. I would like to extend our warm welcome to new students and families to the school community. This semester we have also seen a good number

of young adult students joining our adult beginner's class. I wish they will find the study enjoyable and rewarding. Best wishes also go to the students who have left school for preparing their HSC and other endeavours. On behalf the teachers, I wish they may achieve their new goals and keep refreshing the Chinese language skills learnt here. Please drop in to say hello to us when you are around.

In the first half of the year we focused mainly on classroom teaching and training of teachers. We had twenty weeks of classes in the first semester, including the mid-term examination. Overall, the outcomes have been satisfactory, with the support of parents and the hard work of their children in pursuing the study of Chinese and the continuing effort of our teachers. Most students have achieved good results in the mid-term exams. Many parents have shown their appreciation to the work of our teachers, and praised their devotion and commitment in particular.

We have achieved great results in the 26th National Chinese Eisteddfod. Our teams were the champion in the Senior Division and 2nd Runner-up in the 12 to 14 Years Division. Individually, our students have also fared extremely well. Together they collected three gold, two silver and three bronze medals. The competition was very intense this year. The excellent results we have achieved showcase the ability and effort of our students and teachers. Four teachers from school have completed the professional education certificate course with the University of Wollongong; another three have completed, or in the course of completing their degree courses in education. So far this term we have altogether 15 classes, from junior to senior, consisting of around 145 students. To ensure the quality and effectiveness of teaching, unlike many others, we adhere strictly to the principle of small-class teaching. We received some very useful verbal and written suggestions from parents, largely on ways of raising the interest of students in the junior classes, improving communications between parents and school and transparency on the syllabi and outlines of teaching. We are hugely grateful for the input. We have indeed considered and implemented some suggested changes. Please rest assured that we have the interest of our students at heart. Let us work together and do what we can for the cause of Chinese culture. We endeavor to organize more extra-curricular activities in term 3 and term 4. So far we have started the teaching valuation from kindergarten to level 3 classes involving school committee members and representatives from parents with emphasis on the class communicative activities.

Through the valuation we wish to exchange the ideas and experience among teachers, management and parents to enhance our teachers' teaching techniques. We will not only as before take part in traditional competitions, but will put in extra effort to improve the overall standard in Chinese among students and to raise and maintain their interest in the study of Chinese language. We will also encourage students, and parents, to participate more in competitions or activities that help to raise their interest in, or enhance their understanding of, Chinese Culture, like Chinese lantern festivals or winter overseas student camps.
