I have received an email from our previous teacher Ms. Lily Ye in commemoration of our beloved adult student Mr. Bill Southern who was very enthusiastic and energetic in pursuing his study goal.

My Memory about Mr. Bill Southern

CCCA-CLS Adult A class started in 2003 when I was the teacher. The class size was about 10 students and Bill was one of them. In the following years, students came and went Bill became one of "oldest" students in term of the time they stayed and the age.

Bill was an active student who shown tremendous interest in studying Chinese Language. He went to China several times every year. Once he came to me before the class telling me he only got off the plane. From the high spirit on his face you could not detect any tiredness. He just simply didn't want to miss a class.

In one end of year presentation day he was chosen to represent students to give a speech. The language of course was Mandarin. His brief and humorous speech made the hall burst with laughing, including little children. He regularly brought out the words he learnt in China such as gossip ("七嘴八舌"), huge crowds ("人山人海"). He bought the Chinese software and with that he could even write Chinese articles. He had written few Chinese articles and all were interesting and colorful. I only did some small polishing work and those later all appeared on our school or CCCA newsletters. As he was managing class account I needed to contact him very often. He called himself as OLD BILL or Southern Bill. Sometimes he needed to make announcement after morning tea, he would be using the Mandarin with "WO YOU YI GE XIAO XI" strong OZ accent saying 我有一个消息 ······ (I have news ···). His experience in learning Mandarin was not to pay attention to the four tones. You only need to speak the sentence to make Chinese understand. Through the Saturday's class we all established very solid friendship. When we heard his sudden passing away we all felt big shock and deep sorrow. He only attended the students' party two week earlier. Studying Chinese was part of Bill's life. I deeply believe he enjoyed it enormously. Bill, we really miss you.
